Preliminary Findings			
<p>Results of phase one fast track submission</p> <p>Swab JRH16 (from pool of blood on lounge floor) was subjected to DNA profiling tests, so that it could be used as a surrogate reference DNA sample for A. Victim. A complete DNA profile was obtained from this sample and I have taken this to represent the DNA profile of A. Victim. An apparent hair was recovered from the swab and has been retained as item JRH16/AB/1.</p> <p>The presence of blood was confirmed on all of the following swabs and samples of blood from each of the swabs have been subjected separately to DNA profiling tests:</p> <p>JRH11 - blood inside cutlery drawer; JRH12 - blood on back door chain; JRH13 - blood on wall at bottom of stairs; JRH14 - blood drip on kitchen floor; and JRH15 - blood on lounge wall.</p> <p>In my opinion, each of the swabs yielded the same male DNA profile. The male DNA profile obtained matches the DNA profile attributed to A. Victim and therefore, in my opinion, in the context of this case it is reasonable to assume that the blood tested has originated from A. Victim himself.</p>
