Issue: Detail the recovery of exhibit ABC/1 and ABC/7 during the scene examination

Fingerprint Recovery (ABC/1) Response:

On (day, date, year) at approximately (time) I attended (an address, England and Wales) during which I conducted a fingerprint examination of the scene resulting in marks were located on the interior and exterior of a broken bathroom window at the rear of the property. I lifted these marks with a piece of clear adhesive tape, which I placed onto to clear acetate. The lift was endorsed with the location details, date, (reference number) and given the exhibit reference number ABC/1.

1. I concluded my examination at approximately (time). Later the same day I sent ABC/1 to the Fingerprint Bureau using the secure internal mail (seal number) having already uploaded ABC/1 to the digital image server under (reference number).

***Fibre Recovery (ABC/7) Response:**

During a visual examination of the above window, I noticed an apparent fibre caught on the window latch. Using a piece of clear adhesive tape, I lifted the fibre and, ensuring that the fibre had been removed from the window and adhered to the tape, I placed it onto clear acetate. The acetate was endorsed with the location details, date, (reference number) and given the exhibit reference number ABC/7.
