Preliminary Findings			
<p>This report relates to a match following searching against the National DNA Database.</p> <p>The crime scene DNA profile (barcode 80123458) obtained from exhibit DJS4 (cigarette end in garden) relating to An address, England/Wales has generated a match to the DNA profile held on the National DNA Database under the name of C. Suspect, DOB 01/01/1992 (barcode 30123455).</p> <p>PLEASE NOTE: In this case, the crime scene DNA profile shows the presence of more than one person – this is called a ‘mixed’ DNA profile. The profile that has been retained on the National DNA Database has been interpreted by the Forensic Service Provider as being sourced from one of the contributors to the DNA profile. If required, a direct comparison can be carried out between the crime scene and subject DNA profiles, by the Forensic Service Provider. This will provide more information about the statistical significance of this match.</p> <p>Technical information, including issues that may affect the interpretation of DNA evidence, such as mixed profiles and discordance, is available from FSPs, CPS, and the National DNA Database documentation websites.</p>
