Preliminary Findings

This report relates to a match following searching against the National DNA Database.

The crime scene DNA profile (barcode 8#######) obtained from exhibit DJS5 (blue 'Nike' baseball cap) relating to An address, England/Wales has generated a match to the DNA profile held on the National DNA Database under the name of A. Suspect, DOB 01/01/1999 (barcode 3#######).

PLEASE NOTE: In this case, the crime scene DNA profile is partial (i.e. incomplete). This often occurs when the crime scene sample is deficient in either quantity or quality of DNA and, as a result, it is only possible to carry out a comparison with A. Suspect's DNA profile, at those corresponding areas of the DNA profile that have produced a result. The crime scene DNA profile that has been loaded to the National DNA Database contains insufficient information to be able to assess the statistical significance of the match at this stage.

If required, a direct comparison can be carried out between the crime scene and subject DNA profile, by the Forensic Service Provider.
