<b>Information and Result</b>			
<p>The footwear recovered from A. Suspect consists of a pair of Nike training shoes (item numbers JAW 4168/01&amp;02).</p> <p>Shoes with this undersole pattern have been encountered on numerous occasions amongst footwear seen by [Force/FSP] in the last year. Nevertheless, this particular pattern type is just one of a vast number of undersole patterns currently available on shoes.</p> <p>The Nike training shoes recovered from A. Suspect were compared in detail to the footwear marks recorded at An Address, items QWE/1 and 2. The marks correspond with the submitted footwear in terms of pattern, size and pattern configuration and the general degree of wear.</p> <p>In my opinion the results of this comparison <b>provides limited / moderate / moderately strong / strong / very strong / extremely strong</b> support for the view that the footwear marks from An Address have been made by the footwear of A. Suspect.</p> <p><b><i>In attempting to convey the strength of the significance of my findings (usually expressed in terms of level of support and excluding inconclusive and conclusive results) I have selected the most appropriate expression from the following:            Limited; moderate; moderately strong; strong; very strong; extremely strong.</i></b></p> <p><b>Please note that the results and conclusion contained within this report have not been peer reviewed at this stage. The findings will be checked by a second footwear expert at the earliest opportunity; it is possible that the strength of the evidence may change following this check. On completion of the peer review, a further SFR will be produced which will supersede this report.</b></p>
